Parking matters to everybody


In addition to the \$740 million commitment to the Liverpool Health and Academic Precinct, funds have been committed for a \$50 million multi-storey car park that will provide more parking spaces and replace the smaller existing multi-storey car park.

The LHAP team is leading a car park working group to implement strategies to minimise and avoid disruptions to parking availability during construction. We understand the importance of parking to hospital patients, visitors and staff and that is why every effort will be made to find solutions that maintain the current number of parking spaces throughout the duration of works.

We've taken steps to relocate some staff parking to off-site locations in order to free up on-site parking for our hospital patients and visitors, and will continue to look at ways to make parking easier.

Early works update

Works to prepare the site are continuing on campus and along surrounding streets, with stormwater, sewer and service upgrade activities scheduled to take place until late August 2020. This will include some night works between now and late July.

Temporary impacts on Campbell, Goulburn and Elizabeth Streets include:

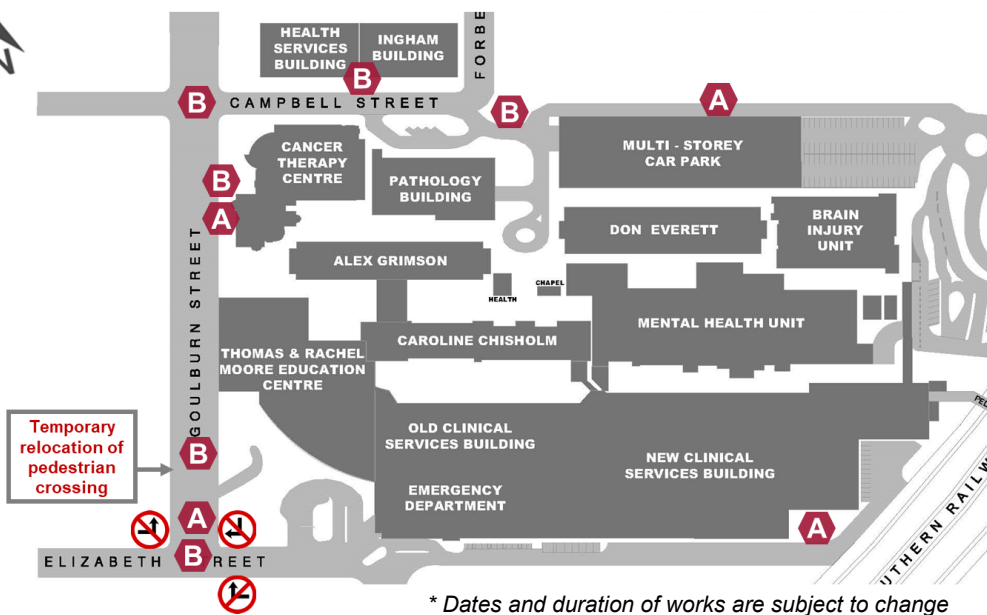
- street parking restrictions
- pedestrian route changes due to footpath works
- temporary relocation of pedestrian crossing on Goulburn Street
- resident only access to Goulburn Street during night works (7pm to 5am) from now until 19 April.

Detours and traffic control will be in place to support pedestrian and vehicle traffic flow in the area while these important works progress.

While there will be some disruptions across the hospital campus until project completion in 2026, we'll aim to provide ample notice of works to help reduce the impact on patients, visitors and staff. We appreciate your patience and remind you to:

- follow instructions and directions from traffic controllers and site staff
- walk only on marked paths and follow all road and site signage
- check signs around your usual parking area for upcoming changes as the project progresses

SUMMARY OF WORKS March to August 2020*

- A Day works**
Impacts to parking and pedestrian/vehicle traffic flow due to road and footpath works at various intervals from 23 March to 30 August. Traffic control will be in place.
- B Night works**
Impacts to pedestrian and vehicle traffic flow due to staged road and footpath works at various intervals from 30 March to 8 July between 7pm and 5am.
These works will include:
 - no right turn from Goulburn Street onto Elizabeth Street
 - no right turn from Elizabeth Street onto Goulburn Street
 - no left turn from Elizabeth Street onto Goulburn Street between 7pm and 5am from 30 March to 19 April.
