

### NAME THE CRANE COMPETITION TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. By entering the Name the Crane Competition (the competition), an entrant is indicating his/her agreement to be bound by these terms and conditions.
2. The purpose of the competition is to name the tower crane on the Liverpool Hospital main works site (worksite).
3. Entries are open to primary school students who go to school in the Liverpool Local Government Area (LGA).
4. The competition is being run by the Liverpool Health and Academic Precinct (LHAP) project team in partnership with the project's design and construction contractor Lendlease.
5. The competition closes at 5pm on Friday 27 May 2022. After this date no further entries to the competition will be permitted.
6. The winner of the competition will be notified by telephone or email by Friday 10 June.
7. No responsibility can be accepted for entries not received for any reason.
8. 9. To enter the competition, entrants must name the tower crane on the Liverpool Hospital worksite, tell us why they've chosen that name, complete their details including name, age and school, and provide their school's contact details.
10. Entries must be submitted via email to [SWSLHD-LHAP@health.nsw.gov.au](mailto:SWSLHD-LHAP@health.nsw.gov.au) by the closing date to be valid.
11. Each entrant may only enter the competition once. Multiple entries from the same student will be disqualified.
12. Prize is generously supplied by the design and construction contractor Lendlease and includes a \$500 EFTPOS gift card for the winner's primary school. The winner and four guests will also be invited to attend an official crane naming ceremony on site at Liverpool Hospital at a date to be advised.
13. The gift card component of the competition prize is intended to support the winner's school with the purchase of educational resources such as library books and/or sports equipment.
14. The crane naming ceremony will follow COVID-19 NSW State Government guidelines and may change any time prior to or on the day of the event, including the maximum (patron) capacity permitted to the venue.
15. The entry must be the entrant's own original work and not been copied from any other work.
16. Each entry is the property of the LHAP project team and it has no obligation to return any entry to an entrant.
17. Judging will be conducted by a panel including a representative of the Liverpool Health and Academic Precinct project team, a South Western Sydney Local Health District employee, a Health Infrastructure representative, a Lendlease representative and a community representative.
18. Entries will be judged on the creativity of the crane's name, and the entrants reasoning of the name, given the child's age. The judging panel's decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
19. Entries which are incomplete, incorrect, offensive, non-serious or incomprehensible will be ruled ineligible.
20. Any personal data relating to winners or any other entrants will be used solely in accordance with current Privacy and Personal Information Protection Act 1998 and will not be disclosed to a third party without the entrant's prior consent.
21. There is no entry fee and no purchase necessary to enter this competition.
22. Prize is not transferable or exchangeable and cannot be taken as cash.
23. Collection of prize will be from Liverpool Hospital. Any transport costs or ancillary costs to attend an official crane naming ceremony at Liverpool Hospital is the winner's responsibility.
